These are common poppies. They have red petals and a black centre.



These are corn chamomiles. They have white petals and a yellow centre. They look like daisies but are bigger.



This is a cornflower. Their flowers are bright blue. Blue butterflies and other insects like to visit them.



This is a blackberry bush. They have prickly branches and white flowers. Have you ever picked blackberries to eat?



These are buttercups. They are small and have yellow petals. Have you ever used them to check if someone likes butter?



These are foxgloves. Their flowers can be pink, red, purple, white or yellow. They are very tall. Each flower is shaped a bit like a finger.
